Contract Negotiations Begin for SeaTac Passenger Service Workers

SeaTac workers made history in 2013 when we joined together to pass Proposition 1, which raised the minimum wage to \$15/hour and ensured union rights at the airport. We not only sparked a national movement for higher wages, we also raised the standards for our families and our communitites. Money that would have gone to the top in profits would now stay in the hands of the workers.

SeaTac passenger service workers are key to our region's economy. In 2017, passenger service workers:

- Served nearly 47 million passengers arriving and departing on 416,124 aircraft
- Contributed an estimated \$22.5 billion in economic activity in Washington State
- Created an estimated \$274 million in economic activity in the City of Tukwila
- Contributed an estimated \$138 million in economic activity in the City of Burien

We Make the Airport Work. That's why we're coming together again to fight for a better contract. Passenger Service Workers know we need:

- Affordable healthcare
- More opportunities for full-time work
- Improved seniority protections
- Job security for long-term leave



PAST MEETS PRESENT: JUSTICE FOR JANITORS AT SEATAC

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, SERGIO SALINAS



Justice for Janitors 2017 at Westlake. June 15 is an international day of justice for janitorial workers.

June 15, 2018 marks the 28th anniversary of Justice for Janitors Day. On this day in 1990, over 400 striking janitors—many of whom were immigrants organizing with SEIU—demonstrated peacefully in an effort to improve the living standards for their families. Their goal was to unionize their employer, ISS, the contractor responsible for servicing most of Los Angeles office buildings. Fifty police officers armed with batons brutally attacked their rally, injuring 38 janitors and arresting many more during the altercation.

We remember June 15th because it changed history for janitors in Los Angeles and ultimately tens of thousands of workers across the U.S. It is a moment whose echoes can be heard even now in the nationwide movement of underpaid and underappreciated working women and men. Today, janitors, security officers, and airport passenger service workers continue to organize and fight to raise standards at their workplaces.

We stood up then, and we will stand up again at SeaTac Airport on June 15th at 12:00pm to commemorate that day & to support nearly 800 SEIU6 passenger service workers who will be negotiating a better contract with their employers. We will also stand up with Prospect workers who are forming a Union and demanding respect and recognition. I urge you to do two things: read more about Justice for Janitors Day, and join us on June 15 to support our sisters and brothers who are fighting for a better life.

SECURITY CONTRACT RATIFIED, BUT EMPLOYERS DELAY

After months of organizing and bargaining, SEIU6 security officers gathered on April 26 to vote on a strong new collective bargaining agreement. With 73% of the present membership voting "YES" to ratify, the security officers overwhelmingly approved the proposal recommended by the member bargaining team. The contract as negotiated sets many industry-leading standards, including wage increases and protections from mandatory overtime.

However, we are not celebrating a victory just yet. Some of the companies we negotiated with are not honoring their end of the bargain. Allied Universal, G4S, and Securitas are refusing to honor the wage raises that were agreed to upon ratification.

These companies represent some of the wealthiest in their industry—not just in the USA, but worldwide. Their refusal to honor our agreement challenges the notion that they were bargaining in good faith, so we are taking them to arbitration to force them to honor their commitments.

In addition to arbitration over honoring wage increases in the CBA, we have a healthcare fight coming in September for security officers. We're fighting for critical steps forward such as more affordable family insurance and 100% employer-paid single coverage. In order to make this happen we need our members to get more involved.
